I fell asleep to the sound of hippos' nocturnal calls and awoke to baboons' mischievous morning antics.

We encountered magnificent lions, elephants, hippos, leopards and other gorgeous wildlife on our daily early-morning and afternoon safari drives in an open Land Rover with our guide, Chief Mambwe.

Sundowner cocktails and hors d'oeuvres were served in the bush against a backdrop of the sublime African sunset.

We went on to Livingstone for an elephantback ride and a breathtaking visit to Victoria Falls. Afterwards we shared a delicious dinner with the people of Songwe Village.

Sitting around a fire under the stars, we talked about family, friends and life in general. Their warm smiles, their laughter, these people who spoke from their hearts – this is the magic of Africa, a land I will never forget.
